The Noonday Demon

"Everything is meaningless," says the Teacher, "completely meaningless!" – Ecclesiastes 1:2

The 70's rock band, Queen, rocks! If I need a pick-me-up during a long drive all I need to do it get Queen going on my Spotify app and I'll be awake and rollin' down the highway once again. "Bohemian Rhapsody" works well as an injection of energy. It's great right from its opening question, "Is this the real life? Is this just fantasy?" to "mamma mia, mamma mia, mamma mia, let me go" to its soft landing that haunts you for the rest of your life:

"Nothing really matters, anyone can see. Nothing really matters, nothing really matters to me." Great music for sure, but what's Freddie Mercury trying to say? Nothing really matters? Really? There are other songs out there with a similar nihilist message. How about the Beatles' "Strawberry Fields Forever?" "I'm going to Strawberry Fields. Nothing is real. And nothing to get hung about. Strawberry Fields forever."

What are these artists picking up on and expressing through these popular songs? Is it depression? Is it a sense that life has no purpose? The fourth century monk, Evagrius, called this "acedia," otherwise known as the "noonday demon." He writes in his *Praktikos* that acedia "instills in the heart of the monk a hatred for the place, a hatred for his very life itself, a hatred for manual labor. He leads him to reflect that charity has departed from among the brethren, that there is no one to give encouragement." Acedia gives a helpful name to a sense of loathing for life that convinces people that "nothing really matters, anyone

can see." It's not depression in the way we think of it, but acedia does describe well the malaise that has gripped so many people, even the whole of modern life.

Kathleen Norris' book *Acedia & Me* describes her discovery of this "noonday demon," giving a name to an affliction she has battled her whole life. Like in the old fairy tale "Rumpelstiltskin," coming to understand acedia allowed her to finally name the enemy she had contended with for years. The insidious nature of this manifestation of slothful despair is why it can go

unnoticed for so long, especially for whole communities. She writes, "I think it likely that much restless boredom, frantic escapism, commitment phobia, and enervating despair that plagues us today is the ancient demon of acedia in modern dress."

On May 19, I am going to begin a new 5 -week book study, looking at Kathleen Norris' *Acedia & Me.* Published in 2008, she explores her relationship with acedia, while also reflecting on her experience of the ups-and-downs of

marriage, the death of her spouse, and finding solace (even as a Protestant) in ancient monastic wisdom. Copies of the book are available now for you to begin reading.

After all, we know that Jesus points the way to what is real, and that in the eyes of God we all matter greatly... matter so much that Jesus died out of love for the world. Once exposed, the noonday demon becomes rather weak when it is faced head on with Christ.

Book Study: Acedia & Me

Begins Sunday May 19

It has been said that a sense of weariness and despair is epidemic in our society. Kathleen Norris, a best-

selling author of several spiritual books, believes that acedia (sometimes called the noonday demon) can help us understand this melancholy feeling for us as individuals and as whole communities. She writes, "at its Greek root, the word acedia means the absence of care. The person afflicted with acedia refuses to care or in incapable of doing so. When life become too challenging and engagement with others too demanding, acedia offers a kind of spiritual morphine: you know the pain is there, yet can't rouse yourself to give a damn." Norris looks at this topic through the lens of her 30-year marriage, the death of her husband, her childhood in Hawaii, the meaning of motherhood, and the insights of ancient spiritual writings. Pastor Tony will be leading a 5-part study exploring this book beginning on Sunday, May 19 at 9:30 am in the Chapel. Copies of the book are available outside the sanctuary for a donation.
