They said to him, "Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread, and give it to them to eat?" 38 And he said to them, "How many loaves have you? Go and see." When they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish." 39Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. 40So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. 41 Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and he divided the two fish among them all. ⁴²And all ate and were filled; ⁴³and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. 44Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men.







BEYOND SUNDAY

DWELL IN THE WORD AND NOTICE HOW IT CONNECTS WITH YOUR LIFE

Recall a time you hosted a crowd of people for gathering that included food. How did you prepare? How concerned were you about the costs or about having enough?

Notice who Jesus has compassion for in our reading today from Mark 6:30-44. Is there anyone who is not blessed by Jesus' compassion and generosity? Compare and contrast the fears of scarcity against the realities of abundance in this story. What does it mean that a little boy shares his food? What does it mean to have 12 baskets full of leftovers?

Compare and contrast your personal fears of scarcity with God's promise of abundance? Can you trust that God has given you enough time, money, food, and necessities for life? How does trusting in God for our needs open us up to practice generosity?
