#### **Every Common Bush Afire with God**



And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. – John 1:14

One of the great stories of the Scriptures comes to us early in Exodus. Moses, in exile having fled from Pharoah, came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There he encountered God through the Burning Bush, which defied all logic. Here was a perfectly normal bush, rooted in the ground, and yet it was aflame. Though the fire and the bush were one, the blazing bush was not consumed by the fire. They illogically dwelled together as one. To God all things are possible, and there at Horeb the God of the universe met Moses in the miraculous while still being grounded in the mundane.

This happens again through the incarnation. In Jesus, "the Word became flesh and lived among us." We celebrate the birth of Christ because the Son of God, fully divine, is grounded in the womb of a woman among the most ordinary of earthly scenes (animals and their food and all the mess that goes with that). His divinity

did not overwhelm the humanity. Instead, they illogically dwelt together as one. To God all things are possible, and there in Bethlehem the God of the universe meets all of humanity in the miraculous while still being grounded in the mundane. Truly, all that is mundane has now been redeemed. As the poet Elizabeth Barrett Browning puts it: "Earth's crammed with Heaven, And every common bush afire with God."

The church recognizes and celebrates this unity of the divine with the mortal during the Seasons of Advent and Christmas. For four Sundays in Advent we anticipate this unity in the birth of Christ and his promised return. As the light produced by the Advent wreath gets brighter, we know the dawn from on high is upon us.

On Christmas, we tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ has been born of Mary. The traditions of Christmas are many and shared by most of the culture around us. There are songs of praise and rituals that are grounded in the Nativity story. There is deep meaning found in our festivities, for we are celebrating together the fulfillment of God's promise and the birth of the Messiah.

In this newsletter you will find information about many of the worship services and activities we have planned here at Our Savior's. Make sure to include some of them in your celebration of Christmas this year. What a powerful witness it is when generations gather to worship on Christmas Eve. Pass on the good news of Christ birth, especially to the younger generations in your family. Where else will they learn that what is mortal and what is divine have become one for them in Jesus? This unity has also happened within them since they are one with Christ in baptism. Praise be to God!




