I Was a Stranger and You Welcomed Me



When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the wise men.

– Matthew 2:16

There are reasons for there being twelve days of Christmas that go beyond maids-a-milking and turtledoves. The story of Christ's birth is too big for one day and so much more than a little town of Bethlehem. There is Zechariah, Elizabeth, and John. There are Joseph's dreams, wise men from the east, and a nervous King Herod seeking to kill. There is Joseph, Mary, and Jesus' flight to Egypt as refugees and the slaughter of the innocents under the orders of a power-mad king. Christ our Lord, born of Mary, was born a refugee within a world of violence. Jesus was a Nazarene who called Bethlehem and Egypt his first homes.

I had the blessing of attending a gathering in December hosted by our Lutheran brothers and sisters at Parroquia San Jose and St. Paul Lutheran. Bishop Joy and several members of her staff participated, but it was the members of Parroquia San Jose we listened to. They shared stories of coming to the United States from Mexico in the 1980's and 90's, without documentation, and what life has been like for them here in Beloit and the Stateline area. They have gotten married, raised children, and have worked in the community for years and years. I learned the term "sacrificial generation," as they have been the ones to do any iob and do whatever it takes for their children and grandchildren to be cared for, receive an education, and be safe.

They shared that anxiety is high among our immigrant neighbors. Pastor Dan Gonzalez-Ortega asked for prayer, support, and the confidence to know that they are not alone as they face the fears of deportation that are before them. Jesus, who began life as an immigrant refugee and who's life ended upon an imperial instrument of execution (the cross), is the Son of God who meets us... indeed meets all people... in our struggles and despair. Christ calls upon us to be his hands and his voice in reflecting God's love through caring service to the church, the community, and the world. Using parables, Jesus teaches about the Kingdom of God

Welcome Statement



Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer him, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."
